4. FIRST AID MEASURES

IF SWALLOWED: Have person sip a glass of water if able to swallow. Do NOT induce vomiting, unless told to by a poison control center or doctor. Do not give anything to an unconscious person.

IF ON SKIN: Wash affected area with plenty of soap and water. Use tepid water if available. If skin irritation occurs: Get medical advice or attention.

IF INHALED: Move person to fresh air. If person is having difficulty breathing, give oxygen. If not breathing, give artificial respiration.

IF IN EYES: Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. If eye irritation persists: Get medical advice or attention.

Medical Conditions Aggravated by Overexposure: Repeated or prolonged exposure may irritate open sores and wounds.

Other Effects: This product is not a carcinogen by NTP, OSHA and ACGIH.

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5. FIREFIGHTING MEASURES

Suitable Extinguishing media: Water spray, foam, CO₂, or dry chemicals may be used in areas where this product is stored.

Specific Hazards: In a fire or if heated, a pressure increase will occur and the container may burst. Promptly isolate the scene by removing all persons from the vicinity of the incident if there is a fire. No action shall be taken involving any personal risk or without suitable training.

PPE and Precautions: Firefighters should wear NIOSH/MSHA approved self-contained breathing apparatus and full protective clothing. Water spray may be ineffective on fire but can protect fire-fighters & cool closed containers. Use fog nozzles if water is used. Do not enter confined fire-space without full bunker gear. (helmet with face shield, bunker coats, gloves & rubber boots).

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

In Case of Spill: No action shall be taken involving any personal risk or without suitable training. Evacuate surrounding areas.

Keep unnecessary and unprotected personnel from entering. Do not touch or walk through spilled material. Do not breathe vapor or mist. Provide adequate ventilation. Wear appropriate respirator when ventilation is inadequate. Put on appropriate personal protective equipment (see Section 8). Avoid dispersal of spilled material and runoff and contact with soil, waterways, drains and sewers. Inform the relevant authorities if the product has caused environmental pollution (sewers, waterways, soil or air). Stop leak if without risk. Move containers from spill area. Approach release from upwind. Prevent entry into sewers, water courses, basements or confined areas. Wash spillages into an effluent treatment plant or proceed as follows. Contain and collect spillage with non-combustible, absorbent material e.g. sand, earth, vermiculite or diatomaceous earth and place in container for disposal according to local regulations (see section 13).

Disposal: Dispose of collected waste in accordance with federal, state and local regulations. Dispose of via a licensed waste disposal contractor. Contaminated absorbent material may pose the same hazard as the spilled product. Note: see section 1 for emergency contact information and section 13 for waste disposal.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Avoid breathing of dust or spray mist. Do not get in eyes, on skin or clothing. Wear OSHA Standard goggles or face shield.

Consult Safety Equipment Supplier. Wear goggles, gloves, apron & footwear impervious to material. Wash clothing before reuse.

Avoid free fall of liquid. Ground containers when transferring. Do not flame cut, braze, or weld. Empty containers are very hazardous! Keep container tightly closed & upright when not in use to prevent leakage.

8. EXPOSURE CONTROLS / PERSONAL PROTECTION

Consult local authorities for acceptable exposure limits.

Engineering measures: If user operations generate dust, fumes, gas, vapor or mist, use process enclosures, local exhaust ventilation or other engineering controls to keep worker exposure to airborne contaminants below any recommended or statutory limits.

Eye/Face Protections: Wear protective eyewear. Contact lenses should not be worn when working with chemicals.

Skin Protection: Wear chemically impervious gloves, long-sleeved shirt, pants, socks and shoes to minimize skin contact. As precautions, wash hands and face with mild soap and water before eating, drinking, smoking or using restroom. After each shift, clean all protective equipment, wash work clothes, and shower.

Respiratory Protection: In case of inadequate ventilation wear respiratory protection. Respirator selection must be based on known or anticipated exposure levels, the hazards of the product and the safe working limits of the selected respirator.

General Protection: Avoid contact with skin, eyes and clothing. Avoid breathing vapors. Wash thoroughly after handling product.

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Note:

When selecting personal protective equipment and clothing, follow all of the manufacturer specifications and recommendations that apply to your specific operation and processing conditions. Take into consideration all working conditions and all chemicals to be handled or processed. Eye wash fountains and drench showers should be located within a 10 second walk from the work area per ANSI Z358.1-2009.


